

AGLAONEMA CARE GUIDE



Aglaonema
Aglaonema modestum

WATER

This plant will handle both wet and dry conditions but will do best when the top 3 inches of the soil dry out. The best method for watering is to bottom water, allowing the plant to wick up as much water as it needs.

SOIL TYPE

All purpose potting soil.

FERTILIZER

Feed with a half strength general liquid fertilizer monthly during the growing season. Do not fertilize in the winter as the plant will naturally slow down its growth.

LIGHT

Can grow in low light conditions or bright indirect light. Be careful not to damage the leaves with bright, direct sunlight which can burn the foliage.

AIR

Prefer temperatures between 65-75 degrees and can handle average household humidity. If your house is very dry, a pebble tray or humidifier may help.

GROWTH

These faster growing houseplants prefer to be slightly root-bound and will only need to be repotted every 2-3 years.
