Pothos

LET'S GET TO KNOW YOU

Also known as Devil's Ivy, Pothos is a beautiful trailing houseplant sure to brighten up any room. Easy to both care for, and train, Pothos plants make a great addition to the home.

LIGHT

Bright and indirect light works best, although Pothos plants are generally amenable to most lighting situations. Growth will be slower in medium light conditions, but your plant will remain healthy. We recommend North or East facing windows, but any location with medium to bright indirect light should do just fine.

WATER

Pothos plants are generally very forgiving and can wait until the soil dries out before watering. Don't leave them dry for too long though or else you may lose some leaves in the process. A common indicator of a thirsty Pothos is when the leaves and stems begin to droop. Be careful not to keep the soil too wet though, as this can lead to root rot.

FERTILIZER

Pothos don't need much food so we recommend fertilizing monthly or bi-monthly with a gentler indoor houseplant fertilizer during the growing season.

PLACEMENT AND TEMPERATURE

Pothos plants need temperatures above 50°F with their preferred temp being between 65° and 75°F. Lovers of humidity, your Pothos will greatly appreciate being placed in an area with higher ambient humidity like a kitchen. This being said, however, Pothos are quite tolerant and will thrive with or without a humidifier.
